Who May Compete:

Age: The FEI age rule applies, which is the age the rider reaches in the calendar year. For example, if the rider becomes 21 years old in 2011, the rider is eligible, but if the rider becomes 22 years old in 2011, the rider is not. If the rider turns 12 anytime in the year 2011, the rider is considered to be 12 for the show.

Score: Rider needs one score of 55% or higher from any USEF, FEI or USEA dressage test of the level or a higher level from June 11, 2010 to June 10, 2011. Note: Division AA riders need one score of 55% or higher at USDF Introductory Test C or any test at Training Level. Previous YDF competitors are automatically eligible at the same level or lower. The score may be received from any occasion (including schooling shows, events, and Pony Club competitions) where the judge is a USDF 'L' graduate, USEF or FEI Dressage judge. Rider must submit [a copy of the front page only of the test with Entry Form](#). A qualifying score is not needed for the Leadline Class.

Rider may compete on a different horse from the one on which the qualifying score was received. Rider may qualify for two consecutive levels with the same horse or any two levels on two different horses (except for Introductory and AA Divisions). A rider qualified at one level may also compete one level below as a second Division. A rider who has previously won a Division may not compete again on the same horse in that Division, with the exception of the Walk/Trot Division and the FEI Divisions.

Horse may be ridden by one rider in two consecutive Divisions, except where noted, or two riders in the same or different Divisions. A horse may compete in two Divisions only. A horse may also be ridden by another rider in the Leadline Class. The welfare of the horse is of utmost importance. Two competitors riding the same horse must keep this in mind when entering optional classes. A horse may only be entered in 2 Sunday classes. Management will review multiple entries using the same horse and address any issues accordingly.

Divisions:

The Divisions are the heart of the Youth Dressage Festival. Each Division consists of three Sections: Written Test (Friday evening), Equitation Class (Saturday), and Dressage Test (Saturday). Each Section is worth 100 points for a total of 300 points. Total points from the three divisions determine placings. Ties are broken by using the Equitation Class score, then Dressage Test score and, if needed, the Written Test score.

For example, for Division #11, the rider will have a written test in their age group, ride in a group equitation class with other riders of their Division, and ride the First Level Test 2 dressage test. A rider entering one of the FEI Divisions rides the Team dressage test of that level. Riders entering two different Divisions will take one written exam (by age) and the same score will be used for each Division. For example, if a rider is riding one horse at the First Level Division and another horse at the Fourth Level Division, the rider will take one written exam and that test score will count for both the rider's First and Fourth Level Division scores. That rider will also ride the higher level Equitation Class. Management may combine Equitation Classes for Third and Fourth Levels and FEI-Level Divisions.

Dressage Test Section:

Class WT – Walk/Trot Division 2011 USDF Introductory Test B, to be ridden in the small arena, 20x40m. For riders ages 14 and under who have never competed in a recognized competition where cantering is required. Riders in this division may not ride in any other division or class except for a Walk/Trot test in the Friday Schooling Show or the Walk/Trot Dressage Trail Class on Sunday. Riders are not eligible for Team Championships.

Class AA – Walk/Trot/Canter Division 2011 USDF Introductory Test C, to be ridden in the small arena 20x40m. For riders who have never competed at First Level or above. Riders in this Division may not ride in any other Division but may compete in the optional classes.

Class BB – USEF Training Level Division B 2011 USEF Training Level Test 3

Class 11 – USEF First Level Division 2011 USEF First Level Test 2

Class 22 – USEF Second Level Division 2011 USEF Second Level Test 2 Unofficial jog required*.

Class 33 – USEF Third Level Division 2011 USEF Third Level Test 2 Unofficial jog required*.

Class 44 – USEF Fourth Level Division 2011 USEF Fourth Level Test 2 Unofficial jog required*.

Class FP – FEI Pony Division 2009 Team Test Unofficial jog required*. Open to riders 16 and under.

Class FJ – FEI Junior Division 2009 Team Test Unofficial jog required*. Open to riders 18 and under.

Class FY – FEI Young Rider Division 2009 Team Test Unofficial jog required*. Open to riders 21 and under.

Class PEA - Para Equestrian Division A – IPEC Test Grade I, Test 6(ab)

Open to riders with a permanent physical disability who have never competed in the Warm-Up or Championship level tests for their classification grade, or at Training Level or above. *Riders in this Division may compete only in this Division.*

Class PEB – Para Equestrian Division B – Open to all riders with a permanent physical disability. Riders may choose to compete in any one of the following four IPEC Tests that is most appropriate for their skill level: Grade I, Test 7(ab) **or** Grade II, Test 21 **or** Grade III, Test 31 **or** Grade IV, Test 51. [State test on Entry Form](#). Riders in this Division may also enter another Division, if qualified.

Additional information for Para Equestrian Divisions A and B:

1. The age limit to compete in these Divisions is 25, as per the IPEC rules.
2. Riders must either include a copy of their national or IPEC classification card, their USEF Dispensation Certificate, or medical documentation which would be reviewed by the Show Committee to ensure the rider meets the minimum criteria for a physical disability. Riders with cognitive disabilities do not qualify to compete.
3. Compensating aids and special equipment used must follow the USEF/IPEC rules and are subject to approval by the Show Committee.
4. Copies of the tests being offered are available for download from www.ipec-athletes.de, or by contacting the Show Secretary.

Written Test Section:

Consists of multiple choice or fill-in-the blanks questions. [Please note on Entry Form if special test-taking needs](#) are required.

Equitation Class Section:

This is a group class. The riders will be asked to perform at the level of their Dressage Test, with that level's gaits. Extra movements are not requested except where the judge feels the need for added input from the rider. The rider's position and seat will be judged along with the correct use and effect of the aids. The rider's position will be judged as it relates to the horse's balance, i.e., a rider with a classical hunt seat position would be acceptable at Training Level but not at Third Level. Riders competing in two Divisions will ride in the equitation class of the highest level only (only one equitation class).

Optional Classes:

Entries may be limited before Closing Date – send your entries as early as possible. Entries for oversubscribed classes will be accepted in order of receipt.

Riders must be entered in a Division in order to also enter optional classes at YDF, except for Handler, Judging Sport Horse Conformation, Leadline Classes and Cover Art.

USDF Region 8 Youth Team Competition: Teams are made up of three or four riders of any levels except Walk/Trot. Highest three Division scores count. [Team members and team name must be declared on the Entry Form](#) or to the Show Secretary no later than 5 p.m. Friday, July 8. This is not a separate ride. A rider may be on only one team. Scores are used from the rider's higher Division. Riders do not need to be from Region 8 or be members of USDF.

Schooling Show (Friday): Only one test per rider/horse combination allowed. There is limited available for these classes due to time constraints. Judge will be present to score your test. Riders will compute their own final score – awards by percentage - include fee on Entry Form. Tests may be picked up and scored at the Volunteer Table.

Handler Class (Friday), Class HDL: Presenting a horse (or pony) on a Triangle. To enter this class rider must have attended a Sport Horse Youth Program Clinic or have shown a horse in a Handler Class at a recognized show. Each entry will include a horse, a lead handler and a whip handler. This in-hand class on the triangle will be judged on the lead handler and the whip handler based on how they work together as a team. Go to the Youth Dressage Festival Website for more information.

Judging Sport Horse Conformation (Friday), Class JHC: No horse needed. Class will be score on how closely competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Go to the Youth Dressage Festival for more information.

Participants in the Handler and Judging Sport Horse Conformation Classes do not need to compete in a Division. The number of competitors will be limited.

Practice Ride (Friday): A 10-minute session to ride a test in one of the show arenas, on a first-come, first-served basis. There is no judge. Coaching is allowed. A \$10 fee paid directly to the ring steward. Do not put this on your Entry Form. Sign up for time at the ring on arrival at show grounds. Rings open 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Any rider entering an arena without the permission of the ring steward who is collecting the \$10 fee will be eliminated from the show.

Dressage Trail Class (Sunday): Riders guide their horses through a preset pattern that demonstrates the practical goals of dressage training. Potential trail horse patterns are available on the Youth Dressage Festival website. Each horse/rider combination may enter only one Trail Class.

Class DT1 Walk/trot only.

Class DT2 Includes canter, more difficult tests may include a bridge, backing a turn, small jump, etc.

Musical Freestyle Class (Sunday): Class will be limited to 25 riders on a first come, first serve basis. Riders may ride any USPC Training Level, USEF or FEI Freestyle. [Indicate level on entry form](#). Riders must have received one freestyle score of 62% at the level to be eligible. Rider must submit front page only of the qualifying test. Please check USDF/FEI rules for requirements. .

Prix Caprilli Class (Sunday): Dressage test with jumps, ridden in a standard dressage arena. Tests posted on the Youth Dressage Festival website.

Class PCT Training Level Training Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'. Open to all riders except Walk/Trot Division.

Class PCF First Level First Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'6". Open to all riders competing First Level and above.

Leadline Class (Sunday): Open to riders at least 4 years old but no older than 8. Test posted on the Youth Dressage Festival website. Rider to be led through the test, saluting at the beginning and end. Rider may either walk or trot the 20-meter circle. No qualifying requirement.

Other Competitions (No Entry Fee):

Cover Art Contest (Deadline May 31, 2011) - A drawing by anyone under 21 will be chosen to appear on the cover of the Show Program. The artist does not have to be entered in the show. Other artwork submitted but not chosen for the cover will also be included inside the Program. All artwork should be no larger than 8" x 11" and should be in black/white. Vertical is preferred (like the front of a book). Do not include words or numbers in the drawings, but do sign them at the bottom. Include your name, hometown and age written on the back of the drawings. Send to: Margaret Freeman, 10 Greeley Ct., Mt Kisco NY 10549. If you wish to have your artwork returned, please send along a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Tack Room Competition - Teams or groups of riders who are stabled together may enter this competition. Stall Areas/Tack Rooms will be judged on set-up, cleanliness, and originality. Emphasis will be placed on originality. No flammable materials or lights. [To request stabling together, use the Entry Form and the same stable name](#). Judging will take place on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 1:30 PM.

Turn Out Inspection - On Saturday riders may present themselves before their first ride for an inspection of horse, rider, and tack at the specified area.

Awards:

- Grand Champion and Reserve Ribbons and Prizes for overall highest score.
- Ten Ribbons and Prizes for each Division. The trainer of each Division winner will receive an award.
- Six ribbons for each Section (Written Test, Equitation Class and Dressage Test) within each Division. Ribbons may be picked up at the Awards Table after results are posted.
- Six ribbons in each Class.
- Awards for top scorers in Turn-Out Inspection and Stall Area/Tack Room Competition.
- USDF Region 8 Youth Team Competition ribbons.
- Roving Judge Awards to be presented throughout the show.
- Parent Award/Volunteer Award by random draw.
- Special Awards. See Page 8.

Entries:

Your complete entry MUST be received by the closing date. If you are trying to get your [qualifying score on the last weekend](#), send in your entry early and then fax the sheet of your final score to the Show Secretary. If you do not get your qualifying score, contact the Show Secretary before the Closing Date and your entry will be returned minus a \$10 office fee.

Checks payable to: Dressage4Kids, Inc. [With the exception of sponsored teams, a separate check must be enclosed with each entry unless previous arrangements have been made with the Show Secretary.](#)

Coggins Test dated within 12 months of show must accompany entry. Please specify your [birth date](#) on your entry.

Post entries may be accepted to fill scratches at management's discretion with a \$25 office fee. Do not expect to be able to change entries after the closing date. No refunds after closing date. A \$10 office fee will be charged for refunds made before closing date. Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes. Secretary will choose most legible, correct, and neatest early entry for a special award.

Younger children should be kept with their parents for proper supervision.

Stabling:

No horses are to arrive before 3 p.m. on Thursday. Stabling in permanent 12x12 stalls. [Riders requesting adjoining stalls must use the same stable name \(not team name\) on all Entry Forms.](#) You may not change stalls after you arrive. Only riders who have prepaid an extra fee may arrive on Thursday and only between 3 and 8 PM.

Please note: [In the Stabling section of the Entry Form](#) - Farm Name is the farm/stable where you ride, Team Name is the name of the team for the USDF Region 8 Youth Team Competition, and Stable Name is the name that all riders who want to stable together will give.

Hay and shavings are available to buy at designated times. There will be no shavings in the stalls and they cannot be pre-ordered. They may be purchased and picked up on arrival. Shavings are estimated to be \$8 a bag; hay, \$9 a bale. Each stall needs approximately 4 or 5 bags to bed it. All hay/shavings prices are subject to change; please check the Youth Dressage Festival website. It will be helpful where possible to have a member of your group arrive before the horses to buy and transport the shavings to the stalls.

Fans for the stalls are highly recommended but must be unplugged by 7 p.m. each evening.

Ads must comply with the guidelines set forth in the Earn Credits Toward Stabling page on the Youth Dressage Festival website.

Payment and ads must be received by May 31, 2011. There are no exceptions.

RULES:

Competitor's Volunteer Requirement: All competitors MUST volunteer for at least 2 hours during the show. Once you have arrived and have your horse stabled, get your packet from the Show Secretary, check your ride times, and then go to the Volunteer Booth for your assignment(s). There is a possibility to fulfill your Volunteer Requirement on Thursday or Friday. Sunday volunteers may only need to give an hour.

Attire: Riders may wear traditional show attire. If coats are waived due to heat (often the case), only short or long-sleeved shirts are allowed, no T-shirts. Informal attire (short or long-sleeved polo shirts) also is acceptable in the performance arena in place of traditional show attire. Teams may want to have matching shirts. All riders must wear proper attire when mounted. ASTM/SEI-approved helmets are required for all riders when mounted. FEI Young Riders may wear top hats. The wearing of an improper helmet is grounds for disqualification. Whips and blunt spurs are allowed. Judges may deduct up to two points for messy attire in the performance arena. Award recipients must be in neat competition attire (unmounted) to receive their Division awards.

Numbers: Horses must wear a bridle number while competing or being exercised. In addition to the bridle number on the horse, riders must wear back numbers in the Equitation Class. Bridle and back numbers are in the packet you receive at the show office.

Tack and bits must follow USEF dressage rules. Bits used in competition must be the same bits used in the warm-up immediately preceding the competition. Draw reins are not permitted at any time on the show grounds. Horse boots and/or polos are allowed in warm-up areas only. Horse boots and polos are not permitted while competing. The Show Management reserves the right to inspect any rider and their equipment at any time for compliance with these show rules. Non-compliance will be grounds for disqualification.

No coaching is allowed any time while the rider is competing. The only person allowed to ride the horse on the show grounds is the competitor(s) entered on that horse. Any rider receiving coaching while in the competition ring will be disqualified whether the rider requested such assistance or not. Any visual or verbal communication with the rider is considered coaching.

Readers are allowed for Prix Caprilli and Dressage Trail classes only. All other tests must be ridden from memory.

Ring stewards are not there to assist the riders with their times or after whom they ride. The riders need to know in what ring they ride, their times, and the numbers of the riders ahead of them. Do not ask the stewards.

Parking Five points may be taken off the final score of any rider whose vehicle is parked in illegal parking areas. Two-horse trailers will be allowed 15 minutes to unload; larger vehicles will be allowed one-half hour to unload. After these times, all vehicles will have to be moved to parking areas. All trailers must be parked in the Campground area.

Golf carts or any motorized vehicle (i.e. scooters) brought to the show may be operated only by licensed drivers.

Dogs must be leashed and kept quiet in stabling and riding areas.

Adult must supervise all young children at all times.

Infractions of any rules may be cause for elimination or up to a 5-point penalty at the discretion of management.

Information:

Award Times: Management will do their best to inform riders about award times, but it is the riders' responsibility to be on time for awards. No awards will be mailed. Riders will pick up ribbons for the following classes and competitions at the Awards Table (where they pick up their dressage tests): Handler, Judging Sport Horse Conformation, Dressage Trail; Musical Freestyle; Prix Caprilli. The Leadline Class will be awarded in the ring at the end of the Class.

Tentative Times: Times and important additional information will be posted on the Youth Dressage Festival website one week prior to the show, but are subject to change. Official times will be posted by 7 a.m. on each show day.

Arenas: All arenas and warm-up are on sand. Lunging allowed in the lunging ring only.

Farrier: Melvin Rivera will be on the grounds Friday to Sunday. Call (914) 419-1422.

Veterinarian: Rhinebeck Equine will be on call at (845) 876-7085.

CADI: This competition is a qualifying show for the 2011 Children of the Americas Dressage Invitational (CADI), to be held August 2-6 in Concord, Mass. Training sessions with top international coaches will be August 3-4. CADI is an international competition for riders ages 12-14 (FEI age rules) from North and South America. Riders compete in the FEI Children's Preliminary Test (equivalent to USEF First Level) and ride a First Level freestyle. For more information, go to www.bearspotcadi.com.

At the Youth Dressage Festival, the overall top four scoring riders in the Dressage Test from Divisions 11, 22, 33 or 44 qualify for CADI. **You must indicate "CADI Qualifier" on your Entry Form.** Reserve riders will also be named. Dressage4kids, Inc., will pay the CADI entry fees for the riders who qualify at YDF and provide show saddle pads. Riders must pay own travel and hotel expenses.

Roving Trainers: Our wonderful professionals volunteer their time for any competitor who wishes help. As soon as riders know their times, they may sign up on www.youthdressagefestival.com. There is also a sign-up sheet at the Volunteer Booth during the show. The roving trainers will be Mica Mabragana and [others to be determined and will be posted on the Youth Dressage Festival website].

Education and Entertainment: There will be demonstrations throughout the show. There may be opportunities to "Sit with the Judge" and to practice judge. The Braley Gray and Corinne Gray awards and demonstrations are planned for Saturday evening. Saturday evening dinner is available for purchase to parents/guests attending the evening's festivities. A free Pizza Party for competitors and siblings will be held at the same time as the buffet. Meal reservations for **the buffet dinner only should be made on the Entry Form, and payment enclosed.** Concession food will be available from 7 a.m. each day. A Parent/Trainer reception will be held on Friday evening in the Food Court Pavilion while competitors are taking the written test in the VIP Pavilion.

Special Awards:

Unless noted otherwise, highest score means the overall highest score of all three Sections: Dressage Test, Equitation Class, and written Test. [Proof of breed registration required and must be submitted with the entry for all asterisked \(*\) awards.](#) You will not be entered for the award if your breed registration papers are not sent with your entry. Walk/Trot riders are only eligible to receive awards noted by #. Please provide proof of competition for any trophy/award marked with a **.
